Psalms, Epistles, and Revelation: Completion and Eternity

November completes the Psalter, moves through all the epistles with deeper reflection, and journeys through Revelation to the new creation. We then revisit Deuteronomy to recall God's covenant promises. This month synthesizes the entire year's reading, showing how the Bible from beginning to end testifies to Jesus Christ and His eternal glory. As we complete this year-long study, we see how all of God's Word points to Him and shapes us for eternity.

Day 1: Jesus' Final Sacrifice and Hebrews Foundation

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 73-75

New Testament: Hebrews 10:1-39

Psalm: Psalm 141

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What do these psalms question about God's justice? What does Jesus' sacrifice accomplish?

Interpret: Why does the psalmist wrestle with the wicked prospering? Why is one sacrifice enough?

Apply: How do you handle injustice? Do you trust Christ's sufficient sacrifice?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 73:28 with Hebrews 10:12. I am always with You; after this one sacrifice was offered, He sat down at the right hand of God.

Day 2: Faith's Definition and Examples

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 76-78

New Testament: Hebrews 11:1-40

Psalm: Psalm 142

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What do these psalms recall about God's faithfulness? What examples of faith does Hebrews give?

Interpret: Why is remembering God's works crucial? Why are the ancients examples of faith?

Apply: How are you remembering God's faithfulness? Are you living by faith?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 78:5-7 with Hebrews 11:39-40. Establish firm decrees so future generations might know them; all were commended for their faith but did not receive the promises.

Day 3: God's Care and Race Completion

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 79-81

New Testament: Hebrews 12:1-13:25

Psalm: Psalm 143

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How do these psalms appeal for God's help? What does Hebrews say about finishing strong?

Interpret: Why do God's people cry out for restoration? Why must we run our race with endurance?

Apply: How are you calling on God's help? Are you finishing strong?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 79:9 with Hebrews 12:2. Help us, God of our salvation; let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith.

Day 4: Plea for Restoration and Grace Concluding

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 82-84

New Testament: Titus 1:1-3:15

Psalm: Psalm 144

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What does the psalmist appeal for? How does Titus guide churches?

Interpret: Why should God be judge of all? Why are the commands in Titus practical?

Apply: How are you calling for God's justice? How are you living out sound doctrine?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 82:8 with Titus 2:11-12. Rise up, O God, judge the earth; the grace of God appeared and teaches us to renounce ungodliness.

Day 5: Desire for God's House and Philemon's Example

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 85-87

New Testament: Philemon 1:1-25

Psalm: Psalm 145

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What longing do these psalms express? What demonstrates Christian love?

Interpret: Why does the psalmist long for God's house? Why does Paul appeal to love?

Apply: How do you long for God's presence? How are you practicing love?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 84:10 with Philemon 1:7. Better one day in Your courts; your love has given me great joy and encouragement.

Day 6: Deliverance Praised and James' Summary

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 88-90

New Testament: James 1:1-5:20

Psalm: Psalm 146

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What deliverance do these psalms proclaim? What practical wisdom does James offer?

Interpret: Why do the psalmists rejoice in God's deliverance? Why does James emphasize deeds?

Apply: How have you experienced God's deliverance? How are your works demonstrating faith?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 90:14 with James 2:26. Satisfy us in the morning with Your unfailing love; faith without works is dead.

Day 7: God's Faithfulness and Peter's Legacy

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 91-93

New Testament: 1 Peter 1:1-5:14

Psalm: Psalm 147

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What protection do these psalms proclaim? How does Peter encourage suffering believers?

Interpret: Why can we trust in God's protection? Why does Peter emphasize hope in suffering?

Apply: How are you sheltering in God? How does hope sustain you?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 91:11 with 1 Peter 1:3-4. God will command angels concerning you; praise be to God for His great mercy and living hope.

Day 8: Justice and Steadfastness

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 94-96

New Testament: 2 Peter 1:1-3:18

Psalm: Psalm 148

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What does the psalmist declare about God's justice? What does Peter warn about?

Interpret: Why will God uphold justice? Why must believers grow in virtue?

Apply: How are you trusting in God's justice? How are you adding to your faith?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 94:2 with 2 Peter 1:5-7. Rise up, O Judge of the earth; add to your faith virtue, and to virtue knowledge.

Day 9: Universal Praise and John's Epistles

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 97-99

New Testament: 1 John 1:1-5:21

Psalm: Psalm 149

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What universal praise do these psalms call for? What does John teach about love?

Interpret: Why should all creation praise God? Why is love central to faith?

Apply: How are you adding your voice to creation's praise? How is love transforming you?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 97:1 with 1 John 4:7-8. The Lord reigns, let the earth rejoice; love comes from God; whoever loves knows God.

Day 10: Enter His Gates and Shorter Epistles

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 100-102

New Testament: 2 John 1:1-3 John 1:14

Psalm: Psalm 150

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What does Psalm 100 teach about thankfulness? What does John emphasize in brief letters?

Interpret: Why does thankfulness characterize entering God's presence? Why are truth and love essential?

Apply: How are you entering with thanksgiving? How are you walking in truth?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 100:1-2 with 2 John 1:4. Shout for joy; I am very happy to find some of your children walking in truth.

Day 11: God's Majesty and Jude's Final Warning

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 103-105

New Testament: Jude 1:1-25

Psalm: Psalm 1

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What is God's majesty in these psalms? What does Jude warn about deception?

Interpret: Why should we praise God for His mercies? Why must we defend the faith?

Apply: How are you praising God for His character? How are you contending for truth?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 103:8 with Jude 1:3. The Lord is compassionate and gracious; contend for the faith entrusted to the saints.

Day 12: The Great Works and Revelation Begins

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 106-108

New Testament: Revelation 1:1-3:22

Psalm: Psalm 2

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How do these psalms recount God's works? What message does John bring to churches?

Interpret: Why is it important to remember God's works? What do the seven letters reveal?

Apply: How are you remembering God's faithfulness? How are you hearing what the Spirit says?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 106:48 with Revelation 1:5. Praise be to the Lord; from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead.

Day 13: God's Throne and Heaven's Worship

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 109-111

New Testament: Revelation 4:1-6:17

Psalm: Psalm 3

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What is the confidence in these psalms? What worship does John see in heaven?

Interpret: Why can we trust God despite opposition? Why does creation worship the Lamb?

Apply: How are you confident despite enemies? Do you join creation's worship?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 110:1 with Revelation 4:11. The Lord says to my Lord; worthy are You to receive glory and honor and power.

Day 14: Eternity and Judgment Unfolds

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 112-114

New Testament: Revelation 7:1-9:21

Psalm: Psalm 4

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What blessedness marks these psalms? What do the seals and trumpets reveal?

Interpret: Why does the righteous person fear the Lord? What is the purpose of God's judgments?

Apply: How are you fearing God? How do you understand divine judgment?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 112:1 with Revelation 7:14. Blessed are those who fear the Lord; these are those who have washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb.

Day 15: Deliverance and Spiritual Battle

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 115-117

New Testament: Revelation 10:1-12:17

Psalm: Psalm 5

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What does the psalmist emphasize about deliverance? What spiritual warfare does John see?

Interpret: Why is God's faithfulness more reliable than human strength? What does the woman and child represent?

Apply: How are you trusting God's deliverance? Do you understand spiritual conflict?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 115:11 with Revelation 12:5. You who fear the Lord, trust in the Lord; a male child who will rule all nations was born.

Day 16: I Shall Live and Beast Rises

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 118-120

New Testament: Revelation 13:1-15:8

Psalm: Psalm 6

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What confidence does the psalmist express? What does the beast represent?

Interpret: Why does the psalmist live to declare God's works? What is deceptive about worldly power?

Apply: How are you declaring God's works? How do you discern deception?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 118:17 with Revelation 13:8. I will not die but live and will proclaim what the Lord has done; all whose names are not written in the book of life.

Day 17: God Preserves and Babylon Awaits Fall

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 121-123

New Testament: Revelation 16:1-18:24

Psalm: Psalm 7

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What preservation does the psalmist trust in? What happens to Babylon?

Interpret: Why is God's preservation constant? Why does worldly power ultimately fail?

Apply: How are you resting in God's preservation? How do you see temporary power?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 121:4 with Revelation 18:2. The Lord never slumbers; Fallen, fallen is Babylon the Great.

Day 18: Dwelling Together and Wedding Joy

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 124-126

New Testament: Revelation 19:1-20:15

Psalm: Psalm 8

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What unity do these psalms celebrate? What joy does Revelation proclaim?

Interpret: Why is dwelling in unity precious? What is the significance of the wedding?

Apply: How are you pursuing unity? How does the wedding supper inspire your hope?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 133:1 with Revelation 19:7-8. How good and pleasant when brothers dwell together; the wedding of the Lamb has come and His bride is ready.

Day 19: God's Protection and New Creation

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 127-129

New Testament: Revelation 21:1-22:21

Psalm: Psalm 9

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What protection do these psalms describe? What does the new creation look like?

Interpret: Why is building on God's foundation essential? What is the fullness of restoration?

Apply: How are you building on God's foundation? How does the new creation inspire hope?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 127:1 with Revelation 21:3-4. Unless the Lord builds the house; God will dwell with His people and wipe every tear from their eyes.

Day 20: Cries from Deep and God's Word

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 130-132

New Testament: 1 Timothy 1:1-6:21

Psalm: Psalm 10

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What cry comes from the depths in these psalms? What church guidance does Timothy receive?

Interpret: Why does the psalmist cry from deep distress? Why are godly leaders essential?

Apply: How do you cry out from your depths? How are you leading with integrity?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 130:1-2 with 1 Timothy 2:1. Out of the depths I cry to You; I urge that requests be made for all people.

Day 21: Brethren Dwelling and Timothy's Charge

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 133-135

New Testament: 2 Timothy 1:1-4:22

Psalm: Psalm 11

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What precious thing is described in these psalms? What charge does Paul give Timothy?

Interpret: Why is unity like oil flowing down? Why must Timothy be a faithful teacher?

Apply: How are you fostering unity? How are you guarding the deposit of faith?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 133:1 with 2 Timothy 2:2. How good and pleasant; the things you have heard from me entrust to faithful people who will teach others.

Day 22: Hallelu Praise and Titus Leading

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 136-138

New Testament: Titus 1:1-3:15

Psalm: Psalm 12

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What comprehensive praise do these psalms offer? What qualifications does Titus appoint?

Interpret: Why does God's loving-kindness endure forever? Why do character qualifications matter?

Apply: How are you offering comprehensive praise? How are you living out sound doctrine?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 136:1 with Titus 1:7. His love endures forever; an overseer must be blameless, faithful to his wife, not overbearing.

Day 23: God's Knowledge and Philemon's Love

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 139-141

New Testament: Philemon 1:1-25

Psalm: Psalm 13

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How is the psalmist known by God? How does Paul appeal to Philemon?

Interpret: Why is God's knowledge both wonderful and searching? Why does love override command?

Apply: How does being known by God transform you? How are you practicing transformative forgiveness?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 139:1-2 with Philemon 1:9. You know when I sit and when I rise; I appeal to you on the basis of love.

Day 24: Rescue Assured and Hebrews Reread

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 142-144

New Testament: Hebrews 1:1-3:29

Psalm: Psalm 14

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What rescue does the psalmist ask for? How does Hebrews present Christ?

Interpret: Why can the psalmist confidently ask rescue? Why is Jesus superior to all?

Apply: How do you cry out for rescue? Do you see Jesus' supremacy?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 142:6 with Hebrews 1:3. Rescue me from my persecutors; the Son is the radiance of God's glory and sustains all things.

Day 25: Strength and Rest in Christ

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 145-147

New Testament: Hebrews 4:1-7:28

Psalm: Psalm 15

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What strength do these psalms proclaim? How does Jesus provide rest?

Interpret: Why should we praise God's greatness? Why is Christ's priesthood eternal?

Apply: How are you praising God's greatness? How do you experience His rest?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 147:3 with Hebrews 4:9-10. He heals the brokenhearted; there remains a Sabbath rest for God's people.

Day 26: All Creation Praises and Better Covenant

READ

Old Testament: Psalms 148-150

New Testament: Hebrews 8:1-10:39

Psalm: Psalm 16

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How does all creation participate in praise? What is the new covenant's superiority?

Interpret: Why should the entire cosmos praise God? Why is Christ's sacrifice sufficient?

Apply: How do you join creation's praise? How does Christ's sacrifice transform you?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Psalm 150:1 with Hebrews 10:10. Praise Him in His sanctuary; we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus.

Day 27: Cloud of Witnesses

READ

Old Testament: Song of Solomon 1-4

New Testament: Hebrews 11:1-12:13

Psalm: Psalm 17

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: What love does Song of Solomon express? What witnesses surround us?

Interpret: Why does God value human love and devotion? Why do the ancients inspire endurance?

Apply: How are you expressing love and devotion? How does the cloud of witnesses inspire you?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Song of Solomon 1:2 with Hebrews 12:1. Let him kiss me with the kisses of his mouth; surround ourselves with a cloud of witnesses.

Day 28: Love's Strength and Finishing Strong

READ

Old Testament: Song of Solomon 5-8

New Testament: Hebrews 12:14-13:25

Psalm: Psalm 18

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How is love described as victorious? How does Hebrews conclude?

Interpret: Why is love stronger than death? Why must we finish our race faithfully?

Apply: How is love your anchor? How are you running to completion?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Song of Solomon 8:6 with Hebrews 13:20. Love as strong as death; Jesus is the great Shepherd of the sheep, who came back from the dead.

Day 29: Promise Fulfilled in Jesus

READ

Old Testament: Deuteronomy 1-5

New Testament: James 1:1-5:20

Psalm: Psalm 19

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How does Deuteronomy recall God's promises? How does James teach living them?

Interpret: Why does remembering promises matter? Why are works the outflow of faith?

Apply: How are you remembering what God promised? How are your works showing faith?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Deuteronomy 4:9 with James 1:22. Do not neglect or forget the things you have seen; do not merely listen to the word, do what it says.

Day 30: Complete Story, Eternal Glory

READ

Old Testament: Deuteronomy 6-10

New Testament: 1 Peter 1:1-5:14

Psalm: Psalm 20

REFLECT (Observe • Interpret • Apply)

Observe: How does Deuteronomy remind Israel of covenant? How does Peter speak to suffering?

Interpret: Why must each generation remember the covenant? Why can we rejoice in suffering?

Apply: How are you remembering your covenant with God? How is suffering producing perseverance?

EXPLORE (Optional Depth)

Cross-reference: Cross-reference: Deuteronomy 6:6 with 1 Peter 1:7. These commandments are to be on your hearts; your faith is precious and proven genuine through trials.
